



I watched with interest as he and the boys in the midfield would talk and about where to stand and what they wanted to try and do. Angus was one of the boys who along with Elliot in the first stuck to the plan when there was a ball up. Great communication and his ability to link up with quick hands gave our outside runners the chance to break free, Angus is another of the hard working brigade, really please to see Angus looking to hit targets and find a free teammate at every opportunity, showed when Angus looked to kick one way but told Henry to stand on the opposite side in the pocket. Angus outsmarted everyone and changed direction to fire a quick handball over to Henry who was clear and could get a clearing kick from defence. Love it.

Not to be outdone brother Ben worked tirelessly, super energetic around the ground he tires me out watching as he charges back and forth across the ground getting to every contest and

if he can't get there making sure he is an option by using his voice and letting his mate know where he is. The boys down back had a bit more work this week and Ben lead the way taking marks and directing traffic.




