Down 2 men this week, Ben sunning himself in the Pacific and Ryan immersing himself in the cultures of the South East. Anyway, our remaining troops dug in and got dirty against an opposition eager to show they have improved since our meeting earlier in the season.

The first quarter was a battle of the midfields with neither side dominating over the other. After getting over his cold Henry was up about early getting into the action, playing in front as directed and presenting up the middle on the lead when he had the opportunity. The ball went up and down the ground until the boys started to wear the opposition down. They started to run and share the ball into the strong breeze. We had opportunities in the second quarter and play some good footy into the wind, they kicked 2.2 for the quarter and had a 3 point lead at the main break.


A lot of our boys were a bit off their game, the wide open spaces of Stintons did not seem to be agreeable with our smaller bodies, strange how it plays out some days.


