Now he had to show grit, determination, fortitude, and redesign who he was in life. What a heavy burden for anyone to bear, let alone a 24/25 year old. Thankfully, he has commenced a new career and has rediscovered his love of football now playing with the Sharks senior side.

Thank you and well done Daniel for sharing your true feelings, walk to date in life and a vision in going forward. A message all our young players can take on board and put into action, when the going gets tough, or events at times look a little cloudy

I was delightfully advised by the YJFL at Wednesday night's President's meeting of three wonderful achievements in 2018. The boys played at Bulleen Park on Sunday against a well established Bulleen/Templestowe outfit. We had played this team twice before and were aware of what this team had to offer. Our Sharks, rather than biting the head off the prey, manned up and simply walked away from silly behaviour. If their teammates were getting pushed around they stuck up for each other and stood strong. It was great to see the boys show maturity and sense in the matter. We finished our game strongly and smartly. Using vital possessions to move the ball forward against the breeze and run rather than kick which proved successful. Well done to all the boys and the volunteers for there efforts on the day.

They say a week is a long time in footy and for us Carlton supporters even longer. So, heading to the land of nod post Victory the evening before our derby against our local Warranditians, instead of counting sheep but counting the premiership cups adorning the wall of the mighty Princes Park, thinking about some of the all-time great encounters against some of our most despised opposition, who could forget beating the Bombers in the 1999 prelim, Wayne Harmes whacking the ball back in from the 5th row of the G to Ken Sheldon to inflict more premiership pain in the Pies, the world started to make sense again. Waking after a peaceful night's sleep and feeling secure and warm under the doona like I was back sitting in the Jack Elliot Stand where a brown paper bag full of cash could solve all our problems. If only.....

Eventually the Noonan men had to come back to reality and grab their gear and head on down to Warrandyte to meet their teammates and take on the Bloods, keeping with our success from the night before Ben N a true-Blue bagger was made captain.

Each week the coaching team try and come up with a way to challenge the boys, as they are getting towards the end of playing footy in zones we decided that no coaches would be on the ground to help guide them and to give the boys the opportunity to organise themselves during the game, natural leaders start to come out and direct each of their teammates in the zones. It was fantastic to see how they would make sure each other had an opponent and was manning up or that we set up as planned at very ruck contest.

Starting a couple players down keeping the ball in the forward line was going to be difficult but Ollie, Ben N and Elliot never gave up and ensured we kicked a couple goals against the odds giving the midfield reward for effort.

The game was even in the 1st quarter with both teams having their chance to score. Warrandyte moved the ball well across the ground and then forward making our boys work

extra hard both in the midfield and defence. You could sense the crowd was apprehensive and that Warrandyte was keen to put in a strong showing.

At quarter time the boys came in after relishing the opportunity to be masters of their own destiny I was surprised but also pleased at how they adjusted to the umpires interpretation of a mark, where once they would whinge they just accepted the umpiring and adjusted.

The second quarter we had 4 back up forward and this helped our scoring efficiency, Warrandyte found it hard to get the ball deep forward with our tackling pressure being a focus of our effort, the boys made it hard for them to get clear, hunting in packs with one laying the tackle and another shark mopping up the left overs. With a defence first attitude win the ball and attack the boys started to hit the score board. Our movement was starting to get better giving our teammates up the ground a target, the midfield moving across the ground to space for the defenders to clear wide.

Sharks game was kicking into Action. Half time and the boys tucked into some well-earned oranges and a drink. Playing on a bigger ground the boys were working hard and you could see the effort they had been putting in.

Not much to be said but to back yourself look after your mate be positive and attack the ball. Warrandyte kept at it and didn't give up, the Sharks not wanting to let Warrandyte back in started to turn the screws, when challenged the boys dig in and shift up a gear, all the boys have that competitive desire, the best part is they do it as a team not as individuals, working hard in tight, quick hands to someone free and look to deliver to someone in a better spot, weather it be moving the ball from defence to a shot from 15m out to a teammate 5 meters out, the boys look to share the ball and bring each other into the game.

It's heart breaking.

So, to my parent group, you are all amazing in the way you support the boys, always finding the positive points to focus on and having faith that somewhere in the depths of a Sunday morning there is still a love for football.

Despite all this the boys still show the discipline to come to training, put a smile on their faces, have some fun, learn something new and be part of a team.

They always take on board the things we are trying to teach them, sometimes with success, sometimes without. They show effort by supporting their team mates.

They always display sportsmanship, no matter the result. They shake hands, give cheers to the opposition and always give the ultimate respect to the opposition, their club, their families but most importantly themselves.

Boys, if the only thing we take out of this season is our 3 team words – Effort, respect and discipline then we have been successful.

I meant what I said on the weekend that in my eyes "you are all winners". Let's not allow this season to define your football career, this is not what football is about.

And remember "its always better to have tried and lost than not tried at all"...


