Today we celebrated 3 more players 50 games.

Qtr 1:

Round 11 was played at Stintons Reserve in wonderful conditions for footy. Captains Tom B, Will F and Will L led the boys out, with Tom B and Will F also celebrating their 50th games. The signs were good from the outset, with Sharks players running hard, attacking the ball with great vigour and executing great defensive acts when required (i.e. tackling, smothering, blocking and spoiling). Lachie battled away in the ruck and won plenty of the ball around the ground, while Riley, Alby, Will F, Will L and Zane were all electric through the midfield. 
