U16 Black Coaches Report Round 8

After a good win at home last week against Banyule, we travelled out to Bundoora to take on St Damian's / Parade. They've had a tough run so far this season, winless after 7 matches. In some ways it could be a danger game so we needed to be on to ensure we win. More importantly, we needed a great game to celebrate Bruiser's 100th game for the Sharks. If it was not for a nasty wrist injury last year, he would have already gotten there, so sometimes patience is a virtue.

Bruiser and Moose won the toss and kicked down hill with the wind so we needed a good start to take advantage of the conditions. Midfield did a great job winning the clearances and giving us first use of the ball, we were busy kicking 6.6, but a bit wasteful in front of goal. With St Damiens having the wind in the 2nd qtr we needed to continue to be strong in the contest to cut their ball use.

We were able to outscore St Damiens in the 2nd qtr and we were thankfully able to keep control of the game from then on. We were strong across all lines of the ground, threw the magnets around a bit and tried a few new things. I was most pleased with how we ran the ball off half back, or spread from contests to get the ball into fwd 50. We do have an opportunity to improve, kicking 18 goals 24 is a great achievement, but when you get that many shots on goal, we'd prefer a few less points and a few more goals. Great to have a good team performance to celebrate Dan's 100th, looking forward to celebrating Finn's 100th next week. A few notes from the game:

- Bruiser was dangerous, especially in the 1st quarter, tried to set up his team mates with a few goals, always looking to hand pass and bring people into the match, could have had a nice snap over his left shoulder but dished off instead, team first.
- Shezza found himself front and centre and took a nice mark deep in the forward line and kicked a nice set shot.

- Plugger was a handful again, last week it was 20+ contested marks, this week netted 10 goals. Stayed a bit closer to goal and was deadly, a lot of goals from contested marks, but a few from winning his own ground ball. 2nd time cracking 10 in 2 yrs, gave off his 11th to a mate, can only put it down to a sore right foot.
- Crackers slotted the last goal of the game courtesy of Plugger, worked hard in the middle, won a lot of clearances and his defensive work was spot on.
- Rusty had another good match at half back and half forward. Kicked a nice banana and helped set up a few more goals for his team mates.
- Moose co captained with Bruiser and was dangerous up forward and rock like in the final term when we had to defend into the breeze.
- Jacko had a good game up forward, converted from a nice mark inside 50, gave us a target up forward and set up a few goals, clunked a few nice marks.
- Twiggy had a great game strong off half back and creative on the ball, kicked 2 good goals and could have had plenty more.
- Flash had a great game back after missing a few weeks with the flu. Provided a lot of run on the wing or on half back.
- Rupert had a great first game for the sharks, lots of run on the wing, good ball movement and a number of great chase down tackles.
- Fridge was a force in the ruck, setting up a lot of our clearance work in the first half.
- Rat was in everything again, great first half, kicked a nice goal and set up a lot of our fwd 50's.
- Weapon did not have too much work to do given our midfield dominance, but still won a number of key 1:1 contests in the back line. Had a good qtr on the ball in the 3rd term.
- Ox was lively up forward, unlucky to not get a few goals himself, worked hard all game.
- Nugget was really good in the first half at CHB, great behind the ball, had a good 2nd half in the ruck.
- Psycho had another great game, forming a great combination with Crackers in the middle.
- Mozzie was a handful, great first half of footy, 4 shots on goal, some great marking and ball use. Did well in defence in the second half.
- Will filled in from U16 Red after a lay off, played well up forward, started to stick his marking the longer the game went on, unlucky to not bag a few goals with a great snap just bouncing the wrong way.
- Xavier also filled in from U16 Red and did well on the wing and at half back in the last qtr. has a great leap, will take mark of the year one day.

So a great team game, we've not beaten St Damiens for a few years so glad to get one back on them, by a fair margin. Onwards and upwards for next week as we take on St Mary's.

Milestone Banners

A milestone banner is a run through banner that players use to celebrate when they reach 50, 100 or 150 Sharks games played.

Your team manager will be able to let you know when you are reaching milestone game tally

There are two steps to organising the banner:

1. Book the Sharks banner which will frame your child's crepe paper insert.
2. Order or make your own crepe paper insert with your child's detail on it.

PLEASE REFER TO THE CLUB WEBSITE FOR MORE DETAILED INFORMATION. THE BELOW IS ONLY A BRIEF OVERVIEW

STEP 1: BOOK THE SHARKS BANNER

The Club has 2 banners for use by Sharks families to celebrate the milestone games 50 Games and 100 Games (some reach 150 Games)

The outside of the banner is what you book using the online booking form on the website: Sharks Junior Football Club » Run-Through Banner (sharksjfc.org.au)

This form goes to Peter Hume who manages our banner bookings and will liaise with you regarding collection and return

The inside section of the banner is designed to be filled with crepe paper and used as a run through for the players (see Step 2)



STEP 2: ORDERING OR MAKING THE BANNER INSERT

The banner insert is a crepe paper section which attaches to the banner and is designed for the players to run through. You can order the crepe paper banner insert or you can make your own.

Milestone Banners is a company that will make the insert of your banner & deliver it to your door. They need 1-2 weeks notice & prices start from \$150
