

President's Report

Junior sporting clubs are often the glue connecting communities. Sharks Junior Football Club is no exception to this. We are a grass roots, community-driven club with strong links to local schools and the local community.

It's been great to have footy fever back in the neighbourhood and across the suburbs each weekend.

We are thrilled to have made it to the end of a full season, the first in three years.

It is thanks to the support from our sponsors and the dedication of our coaches, team managers, families, committee and life members that players have turned up each week with huge smiles on their faces and have played the sport they love with their friends. For us this is priceless!

We have so many reasons to celebrate this season.

In all, around 400 girls and boys were engaged in football with the Club during 2022. We anticipate this number to grow for 2023 as people start to recover from the pandemic.

In Season 2022, we fielded 16 teams from Under 8s to Colts and Youth Girls including four Girls teams. We also had around 90 registered Auskickers at our centre.

Of our 16 teams 12 were able to play in the finals. We had an impressive nine teams who finished top four in their division and made it to the YJFL finals.

From this we had seven teams going through to the Grand Final and three brought home a premiership flag.

Whilst this is an exciting end to the season, we are not a club that focuses on flags. We like to celebrate what makes us the standout, community club that we are.

Some of our achievements this season include:

- Players in U14, U15 girls YJFL Academy and U13, U14 and U15 YJFL Academy
- Nine players made it into the NAB league Futures squads for Eastern Ranges, Oakleigh Chargers and Northern Knights.
- Three of our U12 girls made the School Sport Victoria 12 and Under Football Team, and one U15 girl made the School Sport Victoria 15 and under Football Team.
- Two of our U16 boys have played for U16 Metro.
- We have one player featured in the All Australian U16.
- We also celebrated two of our Sharks players making their AFL debut this year for North Melbourne and Hawthorn.
- We were thrilled to have our Auskickers back for a full season. This year was made even more special as we celebrated our centre turning 21.
- Opening our new club rooms at Domeney and having club events back on the calendar
- Fielding our first U10 girls' team
- Two incredible captains Ben Duffy and Ava Leonard. With Ava being our first female captain
- We started Working with Mindful Aus and SALT to provide mental health and wellbeing sessions
- We launched a new indigenous designed warm up top
- We were successful with a number of grants thanks to Victorian Government's Change Our Game Activation Grant, Warrandyte Community Bendigo Bank and Manningham Council Small Grants Program
- We have also continued to improve our relationship with the senior club and cricket club as well as other local sporting and community groups. We hope to continue to build these relationships, so we are all working together in the community.

Regardless of where your team finished in season 2022, I would like to take this opportunity to say how proud I am of you all and thank you for your tireless passion and dedication for such a wonderful season.

We pride ourselves on being more than just a footy club and this season has proved that in so many ways.

Lions Club of Park Orchards Community Spirit Award 2022


A huge congratulations to Ava Leonard who was presented with the Lions Club of Park Orchards Community Spirit Award for 2022.



Bullen would become our nemesis bundling us out in week one of the finals and go on to play in the Grand Final and lose to an undefeated Glen Iris.



Under 13's

The start of the season was met with excitement coming from 2 seasons where the boys had played a limited amount of football due to Covid. One of the challenges of the season would be having numbers greater than the YJFL game day allowance of 24 - this would mean boys would be rostered off on selected weeks and most weeks we would play with 24 players leading to boys spending $\frac{1}{4}$ of a game on the bench. This was most challenging when playing sides who had less than 18 players.

The coaching group and parent helpers thought that the boys should have respect for the game, respect for umpires and respect for the opposition. These values were reinforced on a weekly basis and all in all the boys did a fantastic job and this was not missed on opposing teams who often commented on how well our boys behaved whilst still going 'flat out' at the ball.

As the majority of boys in U13s are now at secondary school it was time to introduce a little more structure into their game style. Kicking has improved considerably through hard work), and he is a versatile player who is also really effective re 'shut down' roles.


